Carlos Reed Fund - Supporting Otangarei Talented Youth

Twelve year old Teru Carrington-Bartlett was awarded the Carlos Reed Scholarship, valued at \$10,000. Carlos Reed was a Principal of Otangarei Primary School and gifted \$100,000 to the Northland Foundation to invest on his behalf. The fund has now grown to \$158,680, and the interest can be delivered forever to outstanding Otangarei School students. This scholarship earned Teru five years of boarding at Epsom Girls Grammar School.

Teru was one of the stars of the December 13, 2018 prizegiving at Te Kura o Otangarei / Otangarei Primary School. On top of the high school scholarship, Teru was named I Have A Dream Foundation Dreamer of the Year, and received awards for Exceptional Qualities in Te Reo Maori me nga Tikanga, the Year 8 Academic Award and another award for contributions to music and dance. Music, dance and sport will all be on offer at Epsom Girls Grammar. Teru has visited the school and said the music facilities there are "Cool as." "You can also do music on computers, other rooms have heaps of guitars." Otangarei principal Myles Ferris described Teru as "truly passionate" and says she has driven other Otangarei girls to do their own performances. Mr Ferris said in Teru's case, going to Auckland "brings a breadth of opportunity for Teru."

Health Fund Plus

Recliner Chairs for Northland DHB

Fundraising from local Service Clubs, Kaipara Community Health Trust and individuals has provided enough money to purchase eight new Romeo Recliner chairs for Bay of Islands Hospital and four new chairs for Dargaville.



Countdown Kids Hospital Appeal Campaign

Over 7,500 children and babies are admitted to one of the four Northland hospitals each year.

Funds raised by the Countdown Kids Hospital Appeal help Northland DHB Maternal and Child Health Services afford much-needed medical equipment.

In 2018 the Child Health Team and Countdown raised \$81,000 for diabetes monitors so children like Whaiawa Tito (pictured left) can lead a relatively normal life.

Northland DHB Chief Executive Dr Nick Chamberlain said it is amazing to have received almost \$800,000 over the last 11 years from the Appeal.

"I'm blown away, they've delivered more than we expected. When you walk around our hospitals, you see the significant investment into equipment this money has enabled us to purchase, which we couldn't fund. It's a great partnership."

Home Interaction Parenting Programme - Dargaville

HIPPY - Dargaville received \$10,000 grant from the Northland Grassroots Fund for a contribution towards its operations. HIPPY is a home interaction programme for parents and youngsters that support parents in becoming more actively involved in their children's learning.

The purpose of HIPPY is to deliver education, training and support to economically disadvantaged families in their home to increase the chance of a positive school experience for the children. The parents are also provided an opportunity to train to become tutors - opening doors for education and employment. HIPPY Dargaville is now in its fourth year of operation, and supports 45 families.

Head Teacher at Selwyn Kindergarten states: *"Several of our children are enrolled in this programme and we have been pleased to see and hear that our parents and their children have enjoyed doing this work in the comfort of their own homes. These children have also shown sustained concentration in the interests they show at Kindergarten, a willingness to investigate and problem solve things for themselves and are able to have meaningful conversations about the work they are involved in. My staff and I feel this is an excellent programme for learning at home that complements children's learning in our centre."*

Northland Grassroots Fund

The Northland Foundation via the Northland Grassroots Fund grants around \$80,000 each year to worthy causes and charities. Recipients of Grassroots funding work in the community in one or more of these areas: early childhood, youth development, literacy and numeracy, budgeting, Maori, migrant, refugee and cross-cultural and housing. The Grassroots Panel received 20 applications in 2018 requesting a total of \$209,890 for funding, and after careful consideration the Panel decided on 12 applicants and allocated out \$81,000.
